#### Who needs it?

- All students who are not currently studying in English need to write the English Test.

## May I request an exemption?

- Yes, if you fall under one of the following categories you may request an exemption by checking the box on the other side and supplying the requested documents.
  - Studied in an English institution for at least a year in a regular program grade 6 and up (copy of your latest report card from that school)
  - Come from an English background (along with a copy of your report cards, write a letter explaining/outlining your situation)
  - Taken or are presently registered in a Secondary IV or V English Language Arts (or equivalent) course with English grades of 80 and over in all language competencies [please attach copies of your latest provincial results (MELS) and Secondary IV and V school report cards highlight your English grades]
  - Exemption requests must be submitted by March 1st to be considered

#### How much is it?

- The fee for writing the English Test is \$30 (this is in addition to the \$30 Application Fee).

#### Where and when is it?

- The English Test is written at the college (790 Nérée-Tremblay, Québec).
- The English Test can be written on one of following dates at the time specified (please complete and send us your form to reserve your place):
