Admissions Process

1. Mid-January: Application System opens
 - ** Applications must be submitted via our website (not through SRACQ)
2. March 1st: Deadline for submitting an application for the fall semester
3. Upload your documents
4. English Level Assessment: information e-mailed during the first week of March
5. Applications assessed by the college
6. Letters of Acceptance sent during the first weeks of April
 - ** Applications from applicants outside the province of Québec can take longer
7. Freed spaces will be filled up until the start of classes in August

Information Regarding the English Level Assessment

- The assessment is written online.
- The link will be e-mailed to you early in March.
- This is to evaluate your level of English – not to accept or refuse applicants.
- If you are accepted with a low grade on your assessment, your letter will contain the condition that you improve your knowledge of English over the summer. To achieve this, you have three options to choose from:
 - Take a course offered by St. Lawrence (there will be a fee charged)
 - Participate in an exchange program (Explore)
 - Compile and follow a personalized plan approved by the college
- Objective: to help the student adjust/adapt from studying in French to studying in English
- Applicants applying from an English Québec high school are exempt from this evaluation.
 - ** Applicants taking an “ELA” course are not exempt from this evaluation.

Admission Priority

1. As in the past, applicants who have the right to be educated in English have priority.
2. Secondary IV average from the Ministry of Education
 - Secondary V grades are looked at to ensure the student is taking the required pre-requisites for their program of choice, that they show a continued level of achievement between Secondary IV and V, and for special cases.
 - Note that ELA courses or courses with more units do not provide an advantage.

Results required for Admission

There is no set ministerial average to be admitted to St. Lawrence. Our acceptances vary depending on the program applied for and the number of applications received for the given program.

Fees

- When applying
 - Application Fee: \$30
 - English Level Assessment: \$35
 - ** This fee will be credited to applicants applying from an English Québec high school
 - Evaluation for transcripts from outside the province of Québec (if applicable): \$75
- Semester fees
 - Fees are available on our website and are subject to change.

Miscellaneous

- You can only submit one application, in one program.
- It is possible to request a change of program; however, the other applications received and the places remaining available in the program will both be taken into account when considering the request. These factors can vary a lot if letters of acceptance have already been sent.
- The number of units is not taken into account in the analyses of student results regarding ranking. However, it is strongly recommended not to reduce your efforts in high school as these will benefit your integration to Cégep-level studies.

Law 14 and French Courses

Starting in Fall 2024, the latest installment of Law 14 will be in effect. This final phase will impact the previous progression of two French as a second language courses and/or will require that courses usually taught in English be taught in French. Depending on your eligibility to study in English and, for certificate holders, on your level of French, here are the impacts:

Certificate holders	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• 5 French as a second language courses
Certificate holders who are proficient in French	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• 2 French as a second language courses• 1 program course in French• 1 general education course in French• 1 complementary course in French
Non-certificate holders	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• 3 French courses (preparation for the Épreuve uniforme de français)• 1 program course in French• 1 general education course in French <p>Some students in this group may have to take a remedial French course before commencing the above French course sequence.</p>
