#### 7. New business

# 7.1. Resolution LAW-2023-12: Revised program grids to comply to phase 2 of the implementation of Law 14

E. Berryman explains the need for revised program grids to comply with the second phase of the implementation of Law 14.

F. Sévigny provides further explanations on the changes that Law 14 brought upon the grids and answers questions from members of the board.

**WHEREAS** Law 14 requires that students follow three courses in French or of French depending of their level of fluency;

**Whereas** the programs grids of Social Science, Science, Business, and the double DECs needed to be modified to meet this requirement;

**Whereas** the work on the modification of the grids was done in collaboration with the departments and program committees;

Whereas program committees have recommended the adoption of the grids;

**Whereas** the Commission of Studies has recommended the adoption of the grids by the Governing Board;

**BE IT THEREFORE RESOLVED THAT** the Governing Board adopts the modified program grids and that they be implemented as of the fall 2024 semester.

## 7.2. Resolution LAW-2023-13: Revised Science program grids

E. Berryman informs the board members of the process that led to the presentation of the Revised Science program grids to the board.

E. Berryman answers questions from members of the board.

**Whereas** the *Ministère de l'enseignement supérieur* has revised the Science program, changing competencies and elements of its structure; and

**Whereas** St. Lawrence created a working group to develop on a local version of the program; and

Whereas the grids ensure for the students a normal progression leading to graduation; and

Whereas the grids comply to the requirements of Law 14 (phase 1 and phase 2); and

Whereas the grids were recommended by the Science Program Committee; and

Whereas the grids were recommended by the Commission of Studies;

**BE IT THEREFORE RESOLVED** that the St. Lawrence Governing Board adopts the revised Science program grids and asks that they be implemented as of the fall 2024 semester.

## 7.3. Resolution LAW-2023-14: 2024-2029 St. Lawrence development goals

E. Berryman presents the process that led to the development of the 2024-2029 St. Lawrence development goals and the minor modification brought to the document following a suggestion the Commission of Studies.

• The indicator 4.2.2 was modified from "number of initiatives to support faculty in the pedagogical use of AI in higher education" to "number of initiatives to support faculty in addressing the use of AI in higher education".

E. Berryman, C. Riverin, and C. Talbot answer questions from members of the board.

The board suggests that the development goals be accompanied by remarks informing the reader that the College is at the beginning of its strategic planification and therefore the baselines for some measuring key indicators are yet to be developed.

**Whereas** Bylaw 1 requires that the Champlain Regional College strategic plan integrates the development objectives of each constituent college; and

**Whereas** the St. Lawrence Governing Board adopted by resolution in November 2020 a process leading to the identification of the College's development goals; and

**Whereas** the St. Lawrence Governing Board adopted a resolution in September 2023 to streamline the process so that the development goals be adopted before the end of the 2023 fall semester; and

**Whereas** the process to identify the development goals included consultations with the College community and external stakeholders; and

**Whereas** the consulting firm hired by the Ministère de l'enseignement supéieur to accompany Champlain Regional College and Champlain – St. Lawrence was closely involved in the process leading to the identification of the development goals;

**Whereas** the Commission of Studies recommends the adoption by the Governing Board of the proposed development goals;

**BE IT THEREFORE RESOLVED THAT** the Governing Board adopts the 2024-2029 development goals as presented.

## 7.4. Resolution LAW-2023-15: Student fees for the 2024-2025 academic year

E. Berryman presents the need for increasing the Student auxiliary fees for the 2024-2025 academic year and the proposed increase.

E. Berryman answers to questions from members of the board.

**Whereas** CEGEPs charge auxiliary fees to students in order to cover expenses such as those related to psychosocial services and socio-cultural activities; and

**Whereas** the Quebec government adopted last year la *Loi limitant l'indexation de plusieurs tarifs gouvernementaux* whereby an increase in auxiliary fees is limited to 3%; and

Whereas the costs of auxiliary services are increasing;

**BE IT THEREFORE RESOLVED** that for the 2024-2025 academic year:

- The auxiliary fees for full-time students will go from \$170 to \$175 per semester
- The auxiliary fees for part-time students will go from \$38 to \$39 per course.

**Whereas** the CEGEP Champlain – St. Lawrence's annual academic calendar must be accompanied by a resolution of the Governing Board before it is officially published and forwarded to the Ministry; and

**Whereas** the calendar that is presented is in conformity with the requirements set in the *Règlement sur le Régime des Études Collégiales* (RREC); and

**Whereas** the Commission of Studies recommended the academic calendar that is presented to the Governing Board;

**BE IT THEREFORE RESOLVED THAT** the Governing Board officially receives and approves the attached 2024-2025 annual academic calendar of CEGEP Champlain – St. Lawrence.

#### 7.6. Resolution LAW-2023-17: 2023-2024 Revised Academic Calendar

E. Berryman presents the proposed revised calendar for 2023-2024. This version of the calendar is made necessary by the previous strike and potential upcoming strike of the teaching and non-teaching personnel of the College. F. Sévigny brings additional information on the constraints that this new calendar must respect.

E. Berryman and F. Sévigny answer questions from members of the board.

Students body representatives share their concerns that the possibility of adjusting the calendar in case of the partial or total cancellation of the strike generates anxiety among the student body,

**Whereas** the CEGEP Champlain – St. Lawrence's annual academic calendar must be accompanied by a resolution of the Governing Board before it is officially published and forwarded to the Ministry; and

**Whereas** additional strike days have been announced by the "Front Commun" from December 8 to December 14 inclusively; and

**Whereas** the reserved days already integrated in the academic calendar have been used to cover previous strike days; and

**Whereas** the academic calendar of a CEGEP must count at least 82 days of classes and exams; and

**Whereas** St. Lawrence wishes to complete the final evaluations before the Holiday pause in order to allow a start of the winter semester on the scheduled first day of classes (January 15); and

**Whereas** the Commission of Studies did not provide a recommendation on the academic calendar that is presented to the Governing Board because no position received a majority vote;

**BE IT THEREFORE RESOLVED THAT** the Governing Board officially receives and approves the attached revised 2023-2024 academic calendar of CEGEP Champlain – St. Lawrence.

**BE IT THEREFORE ALSO RESOLVED THAT** if the strike days were to be partially or totally canceled, the academic calendar would be adjusted to allow an earlier end of the semester.
